From the Editor's Chair—



The circus has come to town! Actually, by the time you read this, Critical Massive will have come and gone. But they ARE a circus!

I enjoy the event that is “Critical Massive” and the colorful people who show up. They aren't nudists of course, but wear very little if anything; and what they do wear is very colorful! And they know how to Party!

But even more than that, I enjoy the way they treat me when I drive up to the office. They address me, and look upon all of us as “owners” of the property and “hosts.”

Their whole thing is a recognition of the Native American tradition that says we are only transients here on earth, and we don't have a right to destroy it. They treat the planet with respect and are careful not to leave any evidence of their having been here. This is the essence of the “Burning Man” idea.

This is a spiritual principle. And the other side of that is the principal of “ownership.” We LARC members are learning that it's two sides of the same coin. We treat the property here as if we own it, and we respect our relationship to LARC as “owners” by helping to build and establish our community. We don't expect someone else to come along and pick up after us. Critical Massive folks recognize the same truth from the *other side*. They have a certain reverence for the land, which they as temporary dwellers, have no right to “own,” or pillage, or plunder.

If you have ever had employees, you know that those who approach a job as if they were “owners.” are some of the best employees you can have. On the other hand, I must admit that I have never had an employee who avoided leaving any evidence of their ever having been there!

Having the “ownership” mentality is about taking responsibility for what happens. Some politicians have complained that our current president is not “owning” the conditions our country is in. This seems to be the normal political approach in our country: neither political party wants to take responsibility for anything bad. For them, the good news is that there is always the other party to blame. This is why politics is so unhealthy.

Some have treated me as if I were “owner” of this publication, which is why I will and do take responsibility for what appears in these pages, and for what can be improved.

When I became editor I set out to focus on the future and what activities are on the horizon. I cited the example of my high school newspaper which time after time resorted to the cliché that “a good time was had by all” when reporting on past events.

Well, as you know, all print media is having to grapple with the arrival and existence of the internet and digital media. We all receive multiple notices of upcoming events, so that the newsletter is often the final and most redundant notice.

EGGPLANT PARMESAN

This is the Eggplant Parmesan that gets rave reviews at pot lucks. We reduced fat by coating the eggplant with egg whites instead of whole eggs and baking, rather than frying, the slices for a lighter version of this classic.

6 servings; Active Time: 25 minutes Total time: 1 hour 10 minutes

Ingredients

- 2 eggplants, (about 2 pounds total)
- 3 egg whites
- 3 tablespoons water
- 1 cup fine dry breadcrumbs
- 1/2 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese, (1 ounce), divided
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 cup slivered fresh basil leaves
- 2 1/2 cups tomato sauce
- 3/4 cup grated part-skim mozzarella cheese, (3 ounces)

Preparation

1. Preheat oven to 400°F. Coat two baking sheets and an 8-by-11 1/2-inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.
2. Cut eggplants crosswise into 1/4-inch-thick slices. Whisk egg whites and water in a shallow dish until frothy.

Combine breadcrumbs, 1/4 cup of the Parmesan, salt and pepper in another shallow dish. Dip the eggplant slices into the egg-white mixture, then coat with the breadcrumb mixture. (Discard any leftover breadcrumbs and egg white.) Arrange the eggplant slices in a single layer on the prepared baking sheets. Bake for 15 minutes, turn the eggplant slices over, and bake until crisp and golden, about 15 minutes longer.

3. Stir basil into tomato sauce. Spread about 1/2 cup of the sauce in the bottom of the prepared baking dish.

Arrange half of the eggplant slices over the sauce, overlapping slightly. Spoon 1 cup of the remaining sauce over the eggplant and sprinkle with half of the mozzarella cheese. Add a layer of the remaining eggplant slices and top with the remaining sauce, mozzarella and Parmesan. Bake, uncovered, until the sauce bubbles and the top is golden, 15 to 20 minutes.
