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

From the Editor's Chair—



You know you're in trouble when, while you are receiving driving directions to get you where you want to go, you hear the words, "You can't miss it!"

Such was my experience on Sept 22, when I set out to go to the Western Washington University Info Fair in Bellingham. Several of us had volunteered to be at this Info Fair, representing LARC to the masses of impressionable young minds who attend the university. I had stopped off at Safeway in Mt. Vernon to get some snacks and a map and other provisions for the day's adventure. I knew generally where the campus was, but I wanted to make certain that I knew which exit off I-5, I would want to take, and the streets I would need to use to connect with the campus map I had been provided. The store was out of Bellingham maps, but several cashiers were oh so willing to be of assistance to an ol' guy looking for direction. Of course, they couldn't agree on the details that I wanted, and finally gave me the all too familiar catch phrase.

So, as you might have guessed by now, I got off on a number of unfamiliar side streets, and wound around for 20 minutes or so looking for something that looked like a "campus." As you probably know, Universities exist away beyond anything that looks like the small college campus that I attended, and the words "neighborhood," or "expanse," might be more appropriate.
